Visa Information	Non-EU Students coming for more than 6-months must apply for a Tier IV General Student Visa.  Non-EU students coming for less than 6-months will receive a Student Visitor Visa letter.
	Students will need to contact global-opportunities@bristol.ac.uk as early as possible to arrange a visa. Accommodation	Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee Erasmus students a place in university accommodation, so we strongly recommend that Erasmus students start investigating private rental options as early as possible. The Accommodation Office can help with finding private housing. Accommodation costs vary greatly: private housing can cost from £375 to £600 per month, not including bills. We strongly recommend that students arrive a few weeks before the start of term in order to find private accommodation.
