<b>English language proficiency requirements</b>	Bristol does not formally require Erasmus students to have specific English qualifications or scores however as a guideline it is strongly recommended that students have a minimum of 6.5 IELTS (100 TOFEL) - equivalent of B2. Certain subjects require a higher level of English; 7.0 IELTS for Law and Economics; 7.5 IELTS for English Literature.

<p><b>Visa Information</b></p>	<p>Non-EU Students coming for more than 6-months must apply for a Tier IV General Student Visa.          Non-EU students coming for less than 6-months will receive a Student Visitor Visa letter.          Students will need to contact <a href="mailto:global-opportunities@bristol.ac.uk">global-opportunities@bristol.ac.uk</a> as early as possible to arrange a visa. <p><b>Accommodation</b></p>	<p>Unfortunately we cannot guarantee Erasmus students a place in university accommodation, so we strongly recommend that Erasmus students start investigating private rental options as early as possible. The Accommodation Office can help with finding private housing.
