Accommodation	Unfortunately we cannot guarantee Erasmus students a place in
	university accommodation, so we strongly recommend that Erasmus
	students start investigating private rental options as early as possible.
	The Accommodation Office can help with finding private housing.
	Accommodation costs vary greatly: private housing can cost from £375
	to £600 per month, not including bills. We strongly recommend that
	students arrive a few weeks before the start of term in order to find
	<b>private accommodation.</b> Erasmus students are welcome to apply for a
	place in University accommodation once they have received an official
	offer letter from us, but it is important to remember that they are not
	guaranteed a place.
