The Department of Economics



The Department of Economics has an outstanding reputation in the national and international scientific community and is in the forefront of modern economic science. The renowned **Tilburg Ranking** lists the Department as number 31 of the best research institutions in Economics worldwide. Main research areas include game theory, monetary and international macroeconomics, contract theory, labor economics and finance. Faculty members continue to receive not only prestigious awards but also major grants through the European Research Council.





Study Programs



The Master of Science in Economics is a two-year program taught in English, which provides student with extensive knowledge in economic theory as well as in statistical and econometric methods. Erasmus students can choose classes including Decision Theory, Game Theory, Growth and Development Economics, Behavioral Economics, Empirical Banking and Finance, and Securitization, and Effective Banking Programming Practices for Economists. www.econ.uni-bonn.de/studying/master

The Bachelor program Volkswirtschaftslehre is a three-year program taught in German with several classes offered in English. It is a quantitative and research-oriented program and offers a wide range of specialized classes including Health Economics, Economics of Information, Game Theory, Behavioral Economics, Empirical Corporate Finance, and Applied Microeconometrics. Housing
