Orientation programme	All exchange students are given an orientation programme prior to commencing their studies and this is compulsory to attend. Students who fail to attend will have any arrival forms dated for the start of teaching and not the orientation date.
Not staying for the duration of the exchange course.	We cannot guarantee that if a student chooses to leave before the end of the exchange semester that we will be able to facilitate an overseas examination for the affected modules. No alternative assessments will be provided in lieu of this. If the request is not provided in advance of arrival by the home institution, then we will not be able to facilitate as it must be included in the planning before the semester has begun. If a student tries to request this at the beginning of the semester then it will be denied. This request is only possible for the Fall Semester exchange students, we do not offer this service for students here for the Full Year or Spring Semester.
