



Residence permit

Please follow these important steps in order to get your residence permit:

- 1. Go to the Post Office and collect the yellow kit.
- 2. Go to the SAOS Desk and fill out the kit.
- 3. Go to the Central Post Office (Corso Garibaldi 25, Padova), pay the fee and send the kit.
- 4. Keep the receipt issued by the Post office! It is considered your temporary residence permit.
- 5. On the day written on the receipt, go to the Police Headquarters (Questura) for the fingerprints, with: passport-size photographs; the original copies of the documents you sent with the kit; your passport; the receipt of your permit application.

The receipt contains two personal code numbers (User Id and Password) which enable you to follow the state of your application on www.portaleimmigrazione.it

If the application is successful, the electronic residence permit will be issued in at least a month from the date of your first appointment.

In any case, the permit will be issued for the length of your health insurance and for no longer than one year.



To extend your stay in Italy, you will need to start the renewal process in good time, i.e. three months before it expires.

When the permit is ready, the Questura will send you a text message to tell you when you can collect it.

Healthcare

Students coming from EU countries can benefit from medical assistance in Italy thanks to the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC, in Italian "TEAM") issued by the competent health institution in your country of residence.

The EHIC gives you access to the National Health Service for "urgently needed medical treatments" during temporary stay.

You can voluntary register in the National Health Service.

The voluntary registration entitles you to benefit the Italian healthcare services like Italian citizens do; it is valid for one calendar year (from 1st January to 31st December); the payment is not divisible and you cannot apply retroactively.

Non-European students must hold a valid medical insurance in order to apply for their residence permit.

The medical insurance can be obtained through:

- private insurance
- voluntary registration in the National Health Service EHIC (only for students residing in a EU country)

Tuition Fees: 3 instalments per year

The FIRST instalment is €187,00 for first-year students.

The payment is due when enrolling to any degree programme.

The SECOND and the THIRD instalments are calculated according to your income, merit and individual situation.

ISEE

What is ISEE?

ISEE is an official certificate, which indicates your financial standing in any given year based on family status, earnings, property and expenses.

You will need to provide information and documentation regarding you and your family's annual income and assets.

What is it used for?

It is required to access a wide range of economic benefits (tuition fees reductions, Regional Scholarship, ESU Accommodation etc.)

Where can I obtain the ISEE?

The ISEE is issued by the CAF Office (Fiscal Assistance Centre) partner of the University, located in Padova, Via Belzoni 48/50.

PART-TIME JOB

As an international student in Italy, you are free to take a part-time job in order to help cover your costs.

Please note that Non-European students with a permit of stay for study reasons are allowed to work **up to 20 hours/week**.

You could therefore look for part-time job opportunities/student jobs in private companies/organizations.

During your 2nd year of studies, you can also apply for one of the part-time job opportunities offered by our University such as student collaborations (200 hours).



Flashcards. What is it?

The Flash Card proves your student status at the University of Padova and allows you to use certain services, such as access to University areas (e.g.: laboratories) and library loans, electronical recognition before examinations etc.

How do I receive it?

After completing the enrollment procedure, it will be sent to your address. International students who have not indicated an Italian address on Uniweb can collect their Flash Card at the Student Office.

Flash Up Studio

The Flash Card can also be upgraded to Flash Up Studio at one of the branches of Intesa San Paolo bank, so that you can make bank transfers/payments, receive credits scholarships, reimbursements, mobility grants, tutoring grants, etc.

MOBILE PROVIDERS

There are many mobile providers available, each of them offering several voice and data packages. You should compare prices and conditions carefully!

You can get:

- a prepaid SIM card (ricaricabile): it must be regularly recharged with credit vouchers (ricariche) that can be done at tobacconists, bars, ATMs or online
- a mobile contract (abbonamento), a permanent contract at a fixed monthly rate

To get a prepaid SIM card or a contract, you will need:

- identity document/passport
- Italian address
- tax code (codice fiscale)

IDONEITA' (mandatory)



Always remember you have to complete the English idoneità within the first year.

Register and enroll for the exam at the beginning of first semester (https://elearning.unipd.it/economia).

If you pass the test, then you are not required to attend lessons and you can register your eligibility in the first useful exam session (January / February).

If you fail the test do not worry, you can follow the lessons and take the exam in the next regular sessions.

CFU - ECTS

Italian Universities use the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS).

1 ECTS = 1 CFU

("credito formativo universitario") = 7 hours in class

1 academic year = 60

- CFU/ECTS Bachelor's degree programmes = 180 CFU/ECTS
- Master's degree programmes = 120 CFU/ECTS

Exams can be:

- Mandatory: they will be automatically selected by the system (Uniweb)
- **Electives**: 12 CFU you can choose both in dSEA and in other Departments at UniPd

STUDY PLAN

A study plan is a detailed overview of activities to be completed in order to achieve your degree. You must fill out your study plan in Uniweb (on-line portal for students) after the enrollment.

There are two types of study plan:

- 1. Automatic approval: that can be filled in or modified from October to July.
- 2. Proposed CCS approval: this can only be filled in or modified in specific time windows.

Elective courses can be included in the study plan from the beginning or even lately, if they will not be attended during the first year; in this case you can skip the related rule of choice ("Skip rule" button).

The study plan can be confirmed anyway. Only in the last year of the course, the rule for electives becomes mandatory in order to confirm and save your plan. Usually free choice activities are carried out in the last year of the course, but they can be anticipated in previous years.

Rules:

Electives can be selected from the educational activities offered by the University during the current academic year, provided they meet the following requirements:

- the type of course must be "basic", "characterizing" or "similar"
- the scientific disciplinary sector must be defined (for example "SECS-P /07", "IUS / 12", activities with the missing SSD are not accepted)
- the mark must be expressed in thirtieths (you cannot therefore enter language idoneità, internships or other activities)
- the activity must not represent a total or partial reiteration of contents already included in your's academic career.

Check the "elective courses" session for further information.

Students of undergraduate courses can only choose within activities offered by bachelors, students of post-graduate courses (enrolled from 2017/18 onwards) can only choose activities offered by master's degree or single-cycle degree courses.

Take note that **not all Departments** allow students enrolled in other degree programs to include their courses in the plan as "free activities"; Uniweb automatically filters all the non-selectable courses guaranteeing the student a correct choice.

We suggest you to fill in the study plan at the beginning of the academic year in order to be able to register for exams: it can then be modified until you submit the registration for final thesis discussion.

Business Administration, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Economics and Finance courses usually consider the "automatic approval" plan that can be modified anytime between October and July.

Only for Business Administration and Economics and Finance you need to choose the curriculum before filling in the study plan.

EXAMS ENROLLMENT

As previously mentioned, you need to enroll for an exam: it is not automatic! You might choose to take an exam in the second semester session even if its lessons took place in the first semester.

First semester starts in October and closes in January; second semester starts around end of February / beginning of March and ends in the middle of June.

For all dSEA courses, four annual rounds are provided within the sessions defined by the academic calendar.

For instance, for taking an exam of a course held in the first semester, you will have the following possibilities during the academic year:



You can try the same exam once per round; if the mark is not the one you expected, you can improve it giving the exam again.

Once you decide to accept it, this will go into your libretto (online record of your exams' mark).

EXAM RESULTS

The Professors publish the results of the exam on Uniweb.

As they publish the results, you will receive an e-mail with your grade and some rules.

At a specific area of the Uniweb, you have 7 days for:

- Checking the results
- Rejecting the result (irreversible!)

Be careful: the general rule is **SILENT CONSENT**.

If after 7 days you DO NOT reject (explicitly) the grade, then it will be automatically considered as tacit acceptance. Eventually, the grade will enter in your "libretto".

Always remember that **you need 30 CFU total** and to have passed **English idoneità** in order to access the second year exams.



THE REGISTRATION

Lists close few days before the exam date. Check the website for details and deadlines once the dates are published.

For deactivated courses, please contact didattica.economia@unipd.it providing your matriculation number in order for them to open the correct list in Uniweb.

Each student has the right, for deactivated courses in his / her study plan, to obtain a minimum of 3 annual rounds.

Do not plan all exams in one session! For more suggestions, you can contact our tutor junior who are students like you.

FINAL THESIS

The final dissertation, which the student is expected to develop under the supervision of a faculty member, has to be structured as a scientific publication.

The dissertation can cover a great variety of topics using different methodologies such as case studies, statistical analysis on database and surveys.

The assessment of the dissertation by the panel of referees takes into consideration the student ability to select the proper theoretical framework and the right methodology.

The final exam consists of developing a thesis under the guidance of a supervisor, including:

- An accurate description of the chosen theme;
- Bibliographic research;
- Critical review of relevant literature;
- Application of theoretical knowledge and / or techniques of empirical analysis.

The discussion of graduate thesis can be moved up for students admitted to doctorate research who have already submitted their application online.

CHOOSING A TOPIC FOR GRADUATE THESIS

Every year, Professors involved in the Master Degree Courses of the Department propose different thesis topics (at least 5 different topics without any restriction on the number of theses for each topic).

The list of topics will be published on the Intranet.

The student chooses the topic and the possible Supervisor of his thesis exclusively through the Department website, following these steps:

- Starting from a precise date, which will be communicated by the
 Department, students enrolled in the second year of the Master Degree
 Program, can proceed with the selection of the topic only after having
 matured a certain number of credits (to be checked on the related year
 regulation).
- The student self-certifies the fulfillment of this requirement before selecting the topic of the thesis.

EIGHT IMPORTANT STEPS

1. Before applying for graduation

Please check your study plan.

Once graduate application on Uniweb is completed, study plan **cannot** be modified.

Graduates are therefore required to check, before proceeding with the application, that their study plan is in "Approved" status and that it is completed.



Remember that you need at least 80 credits in order to apply for graduation on the portal.

2. Submitting Diploma attainment on Uniweb

Graduate application (on-line procedure, previously approved by the supervisor, necessary for closing the students' career and thesis discussion) must be submitted on Uniweb.

3. Registration of credits on Uniweb

All credits must be registered on Uniweb. You can find the related deadlines in the website.


4. Submitting documents at the didactics office

Students should submit certain documents using the new on-line Moodle procedure.

The new procedure is available at the portal:

http://elearning.unipd.it/economia > Student services > Didactics services (login with SSO credentials, the same used for Uniweb and for University mail). On the same page, the student can find the downloadable forms and the instructions for the upload.

5. Submitting thesis hard copy and on-line upload

The thesis (a copy, glue binding in light cardboard, no spiral binding or other formats that allow the removal or replacement of sheets), signed by the thesis Supervisor on the title page, must be delivered to the didactics office in Via Bassi 1, 5th floor.

Use the **title page A**...... if the thesis Supervisor is a structured professor of the University of Padova belonging to the Department of Economics and management, or if he is an unstructured professor of the university.

Use the **title page B**...... if the thesis Supervisor is a structured lecturer of the University of Padua but does NOT belong to the Department of Economics and management. Insert then, in addition to the Department of Economics and management "Marco Fanno", also the Department of origin of the thesis supervisor.

6. Submitting thesis hard copy to thesis supervisor and co-examiner

The student is also required to deliver a hard copy to the thesis Supervisor and the co-examiner.

Students are invited to promptly contact the co-examiner and make an appointment before the final exam.

If the co-examiner is unable to personally collect a copy of the document, the student must send a copy of the thesis in pdf format by email.

The hard copy delivered to the didactics office will be presented to the graduation committee during the discussion and will then be filed in the student archive at the Students Office.

7. PowerPoint presentation

Graduates who intend to use a PowerPoint presentation during their thesis discussion will have to save it in a USB pen drive and bring it with them the day of discussion.

8. Book return

Students are recommended to return all the books borrowed from the library of Economics and Management before the commencement of graduation sessions.

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FINAL GRADE

The final Grade is expressed out of one hundred and ten (110) and consists on the sum of:

- a) The weighted average of exam grades referred to in Article 4 of the Degree Program Regulations weighed with the relative credits and reported to a hundred tenths (110)
- b) The increase / decrease of the final grade, also expressed out of one hundred and ten (110), obtained in the final examination (thesis).

The maximum score attributable to the final dissertation paper goes from Sufficient to Excellent.

In awarding honors, the Graduation Commission must take into account the student's entire career and the quality of the graduate thesis.

A student can be awarded with honors for his thesis.

If the thesis is written in English, it must always contain a summary (abstract) in Italian.
