Erasmus+ for Studies



Erasmus + it is the integrated program promoted by the EU in the fields of education, vocational training, youth and sport for the period 2021-2027

Articulated in 3 Key Actions:

Key Action 1: learning mobility of individuals

Key Action 2: cooperation among organisations and institutions

Key Action 3: support to policy development and cooperation

KA1: Mobility projects for higher education students

Study abroad for 2 to 12 months during a cycle of study

Destinations in Europe and beyond

Host institution fee waiver

Contributions from the European Commission and UNIPD

Activities completed abroad transferred into your career at UNIPD

Improve language skills



The **Erasmus** + international mobility is possible thanks to agreements signed by our Schools and Departments with other universities abroad.

Each agreement sets: number of students that can participate, duration of the stay and academic area.

All activities and courses completed abroad and the respective ones to be recognised in Padova at the end of mobility are defined through the *Learning Agreement*, a contract signed by the student and the academic coordinators of the institutions involved.

The coordinator for the Erasmus+ agreements at dSEA is prof. Ambra Galeazzo.

Two calls:

- First call deadline 17 January 2023 at 1:00 PM
- Second call (vacant positions) deadline 29 March 2023 at 1:00 PM

Students who participate in the first call resulting eligible (non-winning candidate) can participate even in the second call.



Requirements for applying (Master students):

- Regular enrolment in the first year of one of our Master programs
- In line with payments ot fees
- Candidates applying for the second call will need at least 15 registered
 CFU

1.Erasmus grant funded by the European Commission

Within the EU: approximately from 250 to 350 Euros per month according to the host country

2.Lump sum contribution to travel costs

3.Additional funding from UNIPD, MIUR, Regional Council

Depending on the amount of funds dedicated per year and on the student's position in the ranking for the regional scholarship.

Additional funds awarding is subject to:

- Apply for economic benefits of Uniweb by the set deadline (around July 2023);
- Apply for an ISEE (ISEE parificato, for international students).



The grant is paid in two instalments (after the start of the mobility and after its ending) provided the following conditions are matched:

- An approved LA and all certificates related to the duration of the stay abroad are provided to the Erasmus office (Mobility Unit)
- Signed grant agreement
- At least 12 credits by the end of mobility
- Minimum stay of 2 months/60 days



Candidates with disabilities or spefic certified needs

- You are invited to mention if you are a students with disabilities or learning difficulties when applying (Uniweb)
- An Inclusion unit is available for advice regarding the choice of the host university (inclusione.studenti@unipd.it – 049.8275038)
- National regulations on didabilities foresees special selection measures when over 66%
- Opportunity to get additional funding upon decision of the Erasmus+ National Agency

NB: partners with two separate agreements/areas are considered as 2 destinations!



- Granada E GRANADA01: 20 Master students 6 months
- Graz A GRAZ01: 6 Master students 5 months
- Lipsia D LEIPZIG01: 2 Master students 6 months
- Vilnius LT VILNIUS01: 2 Bachelor students and 2 Master student 5 months



- 1. Non-academic conditions: country, city, living costs, services provided by partner institution
- 2. Careful check on exams planned for my last year at UNIPD according to the study plan
- 3. Analysis of the partner's academic offer (exchange students section of partner's website), course units available Master level, terms of the application, calendar, language and other requirements
- 4. Contact partner offices in case of doubt









When applying you can choose up to 3 destinations sorted by priority.

All the candidate's options are considered for the ranking of each relevant destination, which is sorted by score.

Winners are declared as such and assigned to **only 1 destination** per call.

Priority is taken into account when a candidate results among the winners in more than one ranking.

Candidates with no grant/destination assigned become eligible for all the 3 optioned destinations provided the application has been effectively completed.

Eligibility assures the candidate the place in a waiting list and to take over a selected student in case of withdrawal.

Let's imagine we have 5 candidates (A, B, C, D, E) and 4 destinations with 1 spot available for each of them:

Copenhagen	A (90 points; priority 1)	8 (85, 2)	5 75: 1	E (60; 1) ELIGIBLE
Oslo	A (90:3)	B (85; 1)	75.2	E (60; 2) ELIGIBLE
Las Palmas	A (90:2)	(83.2)	D (75; 3)	
Vienna	(85:3)	C (83; 1)	E (60; 3) ELIGIBLE	



Selection criteria at dSEA



Master students admitted with an Italian diploma

- 80/100 core GPA used for the application
- 20/100 language competences (English + second language)



Master students admitted with a non-Italian diploma

- 40/100 GPA
- 40/100 admission score
- 20/100 language competences (English + second language)



Master students admitted with an Italian diploma


Swiss European mobility Programme Switzerland's Federal Council

Grant: 360 Swiss francs per month

Travel cost lump-sum contribution

The grant is entirely managed by the Federal Council but additional fundings from UNIPD can be awarded just like for Erasmus+

The dSEA has an agreement with SUPSI, a University of Applied Sciences based in Canton Ticino.



Selection criteria and scores are those of the Erasmus+ for Studies in Europe call.

Specific application via Uniweb needed, as it is a separate call for applications.

The suitability of the partner university needs to be evaluated just like for Erasmus partner institutions.

No second call foreseen



Ulisse call for applications



Thanks to the **ULISSE program**, students can benefit from a stay abroad of minimum 2 months.

It is possible to apply for up to 2 destinations.

UNIPD agreements:

 Open to all students from their second year of Bachelor, provided they have at least 40 CFU.

Departmental agreements:

- specifically dedicated to dSEA students and funded by the University of Padova or by the Department of Economics and Management.
- They can be identified by the agreement's information sheet,
 which bears the name of your degree courses.



Calendar and deadlines are the same as for the Erasmus+ first call. It is possible to choose up to 2 destinations.

More details soon from dSEA

- It is possible to apply for all calls, Erasmus+ Europe, SEMP and Ulisse.
- Provided the academic calendars of partner institutions allow it, you can mix mobilities, one per each semester.
 - i.e. an Erasmus + mobility in Europe during the first semester and an Ulisse or SEMP mobility in the second one.
- The duration of the stay can be reduced.
 - i.e. an Erasmus+ 9 or 10-month mobility can be limited to one semester if needed to combine it with an Ulisse mobility.
